CODA Guidelines for the Self-Study Document

Those who are up for a CODA accreditation site visit within the next two years received a notice informing them of the current format for self-study documents.

As you read through the following list, please put yourself in the place of the visiting site team who has the immense responsibility of reading through the documents. Think about how cumbersome it can be to handle books that are too heavy and/or to juggle so many smaller books, all which often have slippery covers. Slippery covers cause slipping and sliding of the books so much they are easily dropped. And too many books means too much to keep track of when trying to find related documentation that demonstrates compliance with each standard.

The narrative in the main self-study book should be as succinct as possible. Really long sentences and repetition of statements does not reinforce the information, it makes it a redundant read that overwhelms the reader. It needs to be a "User friendly document" not an "Overly complicated document". Excellent sentence structure is imperative. Getting an English major or writer to proof the document is ideal.



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Frequency of Citings

At Summer Camp 2015 our choices for courses are based on the frequency of citings per standard. We have increased the number of "Complete Courses" i.e. DH Preclinic, Oral Anatomy, Periodontology, Oral Pathology, Dental Materials, Ethics, Pharmacology/ Medical Emergencies because **Standard 2** is about "Curriculum and Content". For the same reason we offer "Curriculum Management" workshops which are separate classes for DA and DH faculty.

The next most frequently cited standard is **Standard 3: Faculty,** and especially educational methodology. Our DH Clinical Teaching Methodology which is mostly hands-on, has been increased to 12 hours. The general educational methodology courses have been separated into modules since the current trend is to seek general educational methodology from several sources to accumulate 12-16 hours in various topics.

Some teaching centers at colleges and universities are especially adept at online instruction specific to their institutions, so we are leaving that portion for individual schools as most choose to mandate their own protocols and methods of instruction.

Our accreditation workshops are unparalleled at preparing faculty members for their upcoming accreditation site visits. Gwen Welling, former DH Manager at CODA leads the DH Accreditation Workshop and Christine Dominick who has provided accreditation workshops in camp for many years is the all time favorite presenter for DA accreditation according to past DA evaluations. 


DA Frequency of Citings Per Standard


