TalEval Clinical Teaching Methodology (8 ceu's) Two offerings: Saturday, July 22nd and Friday July 28th 8am-5pm

This is clinical teaching methodology workshop that includes a presentation of the foundation on which TalEval was built, outlining the model for the clinical learning environment that assures the students' progression of clinical skill development. The attendees will learn how to smoothly conduct clinic operations where students provide patient centered care and maximize the opportunity for learning. Methods of planning clinical learning experiences, and calibrating on clinical grading will be described in detail. The grading system will be described in detail and a step by step explanation of grading will be provided. The afternoon session is a hands-on experience of grading student-patient case experiences. The course participants will login to our TalEval teaching database and grade case-based student performance. Each attendee must bring their laptop for the hands-on portion of the workshop. <u>1. Advanced Root Instrumentation Workshop (4 ceu's)</u> Sat. July 22, 1:00-5:00 PM

Course Instructor: Christine Dominick, CDA, RDH, M. Oc. Ed and team of Instructors

This is a hands-on workshop with one-on-one instruction in how to teach instrumentation in dental hygiene clinic. There is one instructor to every 5 course participants to ascertain that each participant is calibrated on how to teach and demonstrate instrumentation techniques to students. The lecture component includes an explanation of hand and ultrasonic instruments and how they adapt to anatomical surfaces of tooth roots and methods for accurately debriding and smoothing the surfaces. A Sim-Lab with Porta-Sim stands and periodontally involved typodonts as well as HuFriedy root instruments that are loaned to the participants during the workshop. Instrument sharpening instruction with the "Diamond Pony" (lunch sponsor) is included at the end of the workshop. **Class limited to 30 participants.**

2. Periodontal Instrumentation and DH Clinical Calibration Workshop (8 ceu's) Sun. July 23,8:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Course Instructor: Cynthia Biron RDH, EMT, MA Ed and team of Instructors

This workshop includes a hands-on workshop with one-on-one instruction in how to teach instrumentation starting with preclinic and leading into the second year of dental hygiene clinic. Calibrating on words and ways to impart the skills to students is included in this workshop along with exercises in providing written documentation. There is one instructor to every 5 course participants to ascertain that each participant is calibrated on how to teach and demonstrate instrumentation techniques to students according to the textbook <u>"Periodontal Instrumentation and Advanced Root Instrumentation</u>" by author, Jill S. Gehrig. A Sim-Lab with Porta-Sim stands and periodontally involved typodonts as well as HuFriedy instruments that are loaned to the participants are provided to attendees during the workshop. The workshop includes a calculus detection calibration work session and a corroborative error exercise for calibration of faculty evaluating student instrumentation in a practicum. 3. How to Teach Dental Hygiene Preclinic (4 ceu's) Mon. July 24, 8:00 AM - Noon

Course Presenter: Robin Matloff, RDH, BSDH, JD

This course includes the entire contents of the Community Dentistry course for dental assisting and dental hygiene students. The course includes the course manual, syllabus, power point presentations, lab rotation schedule for community extramural experiences, Rubrics for grading community projects, case based quizzes and exams. The entire course is placed on a flash drive for each course. attendee. (A copyright agreement must be signed to receive the flash drive). The instructor will direct course attendees in the methods of teaching community dentistry to students. 6. How to Teach Preventive Dentistry (4ceu's) Mon. July 24, 1:00-5:00 PM

This course is only offered on alternate years and will not be offered again until 2025. This course includes the entire contents of the Preventive Dentistry course for dental assisting and dental hygiene students. The course includes the course manual, syllabus, power point presentations, class activities, course projects, case based quizzes and exams. The entire course is placed in electronic format on a flash drive for each course attendee. The instructor will direct course attendees in the methods of teaching Preventive Dentistry to students using the "mindfulness" teaching methodology. 7. Dental Assisting Accreditation Workshop (8 ceu's) Tues, July 26, 8AM-5:00 PM

Course Instructors: Christine Dominick, CDA, RDH, M. Oc. Ed; Lorinda Simon, CDA, CRDH, MS

This year we have a complete 2023 accreditation document and exhibits on the course flash drive. The morning session is designed to assist dental assisting educators with the accreditation process, and it provides detailed instructions on demonstrating compliance with accreditation Standards 1 through 2. An emphasis is placed on the sections of standards that are most frequently cited. This course includes electronic documents that are placed on flash drives for each attendee. The first set of exhibits contains an outcomes assessment matrix, outcomes assessment tools, presentations of program. Information on the curriculum, including the Curriculum Management Plan and all aspects of these standards are addressed in this course. Electronic exhibits provide supportive documentation for the clinical education portions of Standard 2. The afternoon session provides detailed instructions on demonstrating compliance with accreditation Standards 3 through 6. The electronic documents on the flash drive for Standard 6 include a Radiation Safety Plan, Exposure Control Plan, Medical Emergency Plan, and Quality Assurance Plan. Complete self-study documents will be available at the end of the day for your review. The Do's and Don'ts of the site visit will be clearly explained to the

8. How to Teach Local Anesthesia (4ceu's) Tues. July 25, 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM

9. How to Teach Periodontology (4 ceu's) Tues. July 25, 1:00-5:00 PM

Course Instructor: Cynthia Wampler, CRDH, MS

This course is only offered on alternate years and will not be offered again until 2025. This course includes the entire contents of the Periodontology course for dental hygiene students. The course includes the course manual, syllabus, power point presentations, class activities, course projects, case based quizzes and exams. The entire course is placed in electronic format on a flash drive for each course attendee. (A signed copyright agreement is required to receive the flash drive.) The instructor will direct course attendees in the methods of teaching Periodontology to students. Ways of simplifying the complex topics of the subject matter are clearly explained so that seasoned and novice educators will be well prepared to deliver the information in their own courses. A special focus on the new American Academy of Periodontology and the European Federation of Periodontology (AAP/EFP) Classifications of Periodontal Diseases will be included in this cours. 10. How to Teach Ethics (4 ceu's) Wed. July 26, 8:00 AM - Noon

This course will provide the participant with the knowledge and skills to comfortably teach a course in ethics. It includes content on the Dental Code of Ethics, jurisprudence, value determination, ethical decision making model, educational theories, dilemma resolution, and ethics in the professional organization, sexual harassment and occupational burnout. A review of the ADEA Statement and Tool for Action on Professionalism in Dental Education will be presented. Participants will have the opportunity to work collaboratively applying case based scenarios as a means for developing critical thinking skills for student learning. The accreditation Standard, "Ethics & Professionalism", will be addressed along with methods of incorporating it throughout the curriculum, measuring the effectiveness of your methods, and demonstrating compliance with the standard. **Class limited to 30 participants**

11. How to Teach Oral Pathology (4 ceu's) Wed, July 26, 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM

Participants will have the opportunity to work with diet diary forms and simulate a counseling session using the most effective talking points and communication skills. 13. How to Teach Office Practice Management (4 ceu's) Wed, July 26, 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM

Course Instructor: Roberta Brown, CDA, RDH, MS

This is a new course and if not well attended will not be offered until 2025. This course includes the contents of a Dental Office Management course for dental assisting or dental hygiene students. The course includes the syllabus, power point presentations, class activities, course projects, and case-based quizzes and exams related to basic office management techniques. These include policy and procedure manuals, verbal and written communication, ethics, financial arrangements, insurance, phone technique, and electronic dental records. This course also includes information on creating a cover letter, resume, and an electronic portfolio for use in job searching. 14. DH Accreditation Workshop (8 ceu's) Thurs. July 27, 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM

This course provides a step by step guide to organizing and preparing a self-study document. We will have completed self-study documents at the end of the day for your review to assist you with planning the format of your own school's document. Guidelines for conducting a successful site visit are provided in this course. The "Do's" and "Don'ts" of a successful site visit will be clearly outlined for the attendees. The course includes electronic documents that serve as templates for exhibits that are in electronic format on a flash drive for each attendee.
